





will also be a top design trend, where storages will be added without compromising on the aesthetics or space. Goregaoker says, "Quilting of fabrics for upholstery will also be a top trend. This will lend softness to any furniture piece and make it visually interesting."

Dark bedrooms are a thing of the past and in 2019 these private spaces will be brighter and greener. While large windows will let in ample natural light, indoor plants will help bring the outside world into the bedroom. Light veneers and dyed veneers will also be in vogue and these will go well with pastel shades of suede such as lime green and light blue. As the focus will mostly be on materials, colours will be on the neutral side, with the addition of one big pop of colour either on the guilt cover or on the large artwork. Popular accent colours include washed-out green, light grey-blues, blush pink or peach tones.

Warm metallic accents, such as antique brass or rose gold, go hand-in-hand with this style.
